

Equal Opportunities Policy

Uniform Education wishes all candidates on its register to be fully aware of the implications of equal opportunities.

Uniform Education takes a positive approach to equal opportunities for all. Equality of opportunity means that all children have the opportunity to achieve the best possible development, regardless of their gender, ability, race, ethnicity, circumstances or age. Some vulnerable children may have been particularly disadvantaged in their access to important opportunities and their health and educational needs will require particular attention in order to optimise their current welfare as well as their long-term outcomes in young adulthood.

Equal Opportunity policies vary across schools and local authorities. However Uniform Education wishes to affirm its complete support of, and compliance with, the equal opportunities policies of the individual schools and authorities with which the Company deals.
